

Timber Legality and Traceability Verification

Towards a legal and sustainable timber trade



Under pressure mainly from environmental NGOs, illegal logging has become a matter of deep concern worldwide

SGS has designed a service geared at assisting both forestry and wood processing companies achieve market recognition for their efforts to improve forest management standards under their control and at assisting companies trading in 'legal' timber products.

The service is called Timber Legality and Traceability Verification (TLTV).

TLTV is an independent verification service de-

signed to ensure that timber has been legally acquired/ produced and sold by a particular forestry company. The legality-verified timber is traced and verified throughout the supply chain.

TLTV provides credible assurance to manufacturers, traders and end buyers that their timber comes from a verifiable origin. Not only is the origin verified as a known origin, but it is also verified as a legal origin.



TLTV is:



An independent verification that timber products have been legally produced and sold throughout the 'chain of custody', for timber producers and traders seeking access to sensitive export markets

An extension of SGS' concept of verification of compliance with agreed requirements in the forest and timber products industry and trade sector

A voluntary, company-level approach which incorporates regular auditing and verification of a company's wood production and tracking information outside any national scheme

THE NEED FOR TLTV

Timber producers and exporters, timber buyers, importers and retailers want to sell to increasingly regulated or environmentally sensitive, but also high-value markets.

Companies are becoming more publicly accountable and want to demonstrate legal compliance internally and externally with international credibility. Bad credentials and a bad image ultimately affect revenues and profit.

TLTV is of particular relevance to companies operating in countries without an internationally credible legality verification system or with a programme that does not cover the full scope of a particular company's stakeholder requirements.

Due to its specific focus on legality and robust methodology, TLTV can further assist companies advance confidently towards full responsible forest management certification under programmes such as FSC or PEFC.

Through its TLTV service, SGS can credibly verify that a particular company demonstrates to the international community a clear commitment to producing or sourcing only "legalityverified" timber and timber products.

TLTV CHAIN OF CUSTODY (COC) SYSTEM FOR LEGALITY-VERIFIED TIMBER

CoC is the unbroken path which products take from the forest to the consumer.

It provides evidence that products originate from verified legal sources.

It verifies that these products are not mixed with products from non-verified forests.

The buyer can rely on the CoC statement even without knowing where the wood initially actually came from.

Only companies that prove to buy legality-verified timber, and guarantee its integrity, can obtain the TLTV-CoC Statement.

Preparation – adjusting standard checklist to suit local laws

Audit and Verification of log/ timber production, tracking data and systems for legal and regulatory compliance:

- the Company: legal and administrative situation; production rights
- the Production Site(s): operational forest site(s) and processing mill(s)
- the Production Activities: forest management, logging, timber processing, timber trading
- the Products: specifications, traceability of logs, bundles etc.

Data Monitoring and processing, information analysis and reporting (optional)

WHAT WILL WE DO?

Chain-of-Custody Monitoring System: audit of the company's tracking system; traceability tests from port back to stump in legitimate forest concession; ownership of products






















The 9 generic principles set out in the next slides represent the minimum requirements set by SGS for application of the SGS TLTV service.

SGS has further developed the following Principles as the SGS 'TLTV Standard', for use by a company to be verified under TLTV ("the Company") in cases where an existing 'definition of legality' meeting these minimum requirements is not available, locally or internationally, or is not preferred.

Principle 1.

The Company is authorised to conduct business in accordance with company laws and other legal requirements of the country where it operates.

Principle 2.

The company has the necessary approvals or authorizations to conduct the relevant activities at the locations under verification.

Principle 3.

The Company respects its social obligations towards local communities, workers, and contractors.

SGS TLTV Standard (generic principles)

Principle 4.

The Company complies with its environmental obligations imposed by laws, regulations and other relevant national and international environmental requirements

Principle 5.

The Company adheres to regulations of forest declarations and taxes

Principle 6.

The Company complies with forest harvesting regulations

The Company complies with processing, transport and trade, regulations

Principle 8.

The Company maintains the necessary registers Principle 9.

The Company has management and chain-of-custody monitoring systems in place which ensure adequate control and traceability of its productions

PNGFIA Aim: to develop a Credible Legal Verification System for the PNG Forest Industry which its Members can use on a Voluntary Basis

- Use the SGS TLTV Service as a mechanism to develop a Legality Checklist for the PNG Forest industry

- Use SGS TLTV Service to test the Checklist, CoC System and Audit process in a single forest concession and sawmill
